Report from Tampa —

36th Annual SC/MLA Meeting

October 13-17, 1987

“SUN, FUN, AND THE BASICS”

On Monday October 12, Hurricane Floyd threatened to cancel the 1987 Annual Meeting of the Southern Chapter/Medical Library Association in Tampa, Florida. By Tuesday, however, rain and accompanying wind were all but forgotten, as Floyd blew out to sea as a tropical storm. Even Wednesday October 14 the first full day of the meeting, wind whipped around the Tampa Hilton, making attendees question the wisdom of holding a seafood buffet on an outdoor terrace and a cocktail cruise aboard the “Belle of St. Petersburg.” But by the time of the events, the weather could not have been more perfect. Some say the evening had the best association banquet ever — complete with whole lobsters.

The CONBLS (the Consortium of Southern Biomedical Libraries, an organization of the former resource libraries of the Southeastern Regional Medical Library Program) Luncheon Meeting allowed for a show of hands of those SC/MLA members already operating or shortly to be providing **telefacsimile service** for interlibrary loan operations. The following institutions indicated this service now or in the near future: Emory, Medical College of Georgia, Meharry, Mercer, Miami, South Florida, University of Alabama at Birmingham, University of Florida, University of Mississippi, and visitor Bowman Gray (Wake Forest).

Sharing Sessions rather than formal speakers were a new concept that worked well. Topics of these sessions included: new technologies, serials online, CD ROM technology, and microcomputer techniques. Alfred N. Brandon spoke on “Transition vs. Tradition in American Medical Publishing.”

Continuing Education included a wide range of choices: The “Complate” Librarian: Practically Speaking; MLA CE #352 Government Information Resources; Quality Assurance for Hospital Librarians; Consultant’s Update: Physicians Information Seeking Skills; and Hospital Library Preceptorship Training.

The topic of the business meeting was “Chapter Implications of the MLA Strategic Planning Document” — sure to be a topic of discussion for a long time to come.

MERLIN ONE YEAR LATER— LIBRARY AUTOMATION AT MEDICAL COLLEGE OF GEORGIA

It has been one year since the implementation of MERLIN at the Medical College of Georgia October 1986. MERLIN is the name of the automated library system which includes the "Library Information System" (LIS) from Georgetown University Medical Center in Washington, DC. Other southern medical schools which have purchased this system are: University of Alabama at Birmingham, University of South Carolina Medical School (Columbia), and Medical University of South Carolina (Charleston).

MERLIN includes an *online public catalog* of books and audiovisuals, journal holdings, and miniMEDLINE™ (a tenth the size of MEDLINE including citations & abstracts for the most recent 1 and 1/2 years). MCG faculty, staff, and students with microcomputers and communications capabilities have dial-in access from their offices as do individuals on the MCG Datapoint Local Area Network (LAN). Features still to come are: Reserves and Interlibrary Loan.

An online version of *Medical Subject Headings* is one of the menu selections of the online catalog — eliminating the need for library users to purchase copies; it can be used by end users doing their own BRS Colleague search strategies, for example. Coming soon will be a file called Current Contents™, a subset of CC™ for the current three months. The intent here is to provide an information "bridge" between the current date and the dates of the miniMEDLINE™ journal articles, which are always 2-6 months behind journal publication.

Dial-in users may also participate in the electronic mail/bulletin board system called MAX (MERLIN's Academic Xchange). MAX "is a microcomputer-based system which serves as a campus-wide E-mail facility, conferencing host, and information bank on library and campus facilities and services; subscribers may download files from a collection of software applications and data files." Information files include library statistics and programs; but the greater use is of the electronic mail system — even by the library staff to the library staff. It's a great way for individuals "stuck" in the public service areas to get answers to questions from other staff without leaving the point of service.
