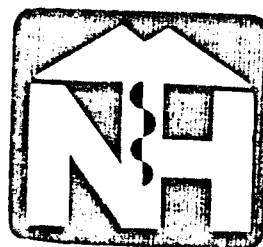



Some of you may be familiar with the consortia session at the SRG meeting held last year in New Orleans. The Atlanta Consortium would like to see this informal opportunity to share ideas concerning consortia continued, so we are sponsoring this year's session in Augusta.

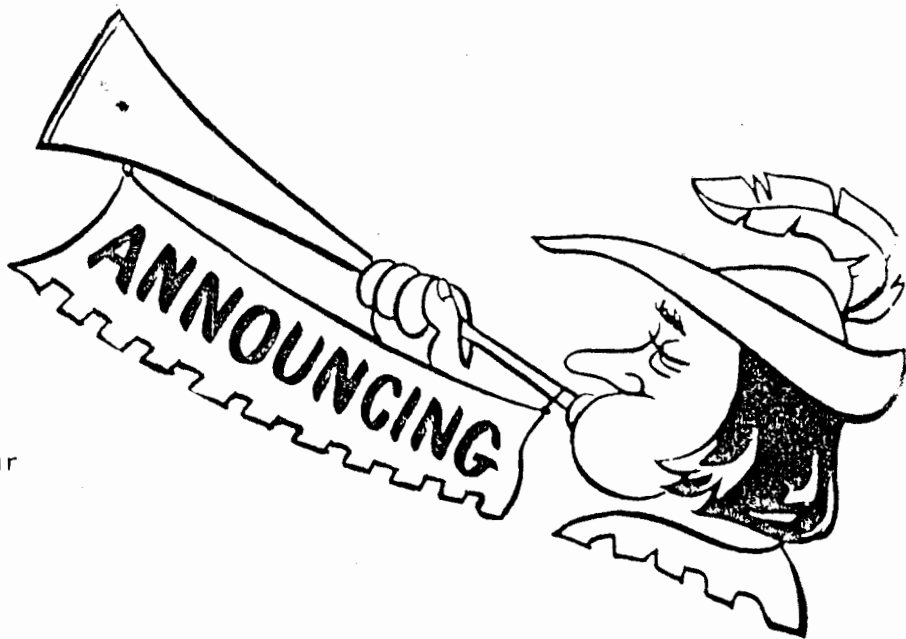

28 FUN RUNS

The 28 age-group heats are strictly Fun Runs with no times or places being recorded except for the winner of each heat. You race yourself and read your time from the clock over the finish line (see the schedule of races for listing of age groups). Runners in the Open Mile should be capable of a 5-minute mile (men) or a 6-minute mile (women).

SPECIALITY MILES

Interspersed throughout the running of the age-group miles are the speciality miles. Entrants who qualify may choose to run in the speciality mile rather than their age-group mile or, if feasible, run both. The following speciality miles have been selected. Hampered by time limitations, we could not accommodate more:

- Librarians Mile.** Entrants must have an MLS or equivalent and run with a book (70 pages or more) in one hand, a floppy disk in the other. (Males and females run together.)
- Walters Mile.** Entrants must run with a tray balancing a glass of water. (Males and females run together.)
- Rugby and Soccer Players Mile.** Entrants must be over 21 and wear their player's uniform — other than footwear. (Males and females run together.)
- Corporate Mile.** Entrants must be full time employees of corporations that employ at least 100 people. (Male and female categories.)
- Medical Mile.** Entrants must be a licensed M.D., R.N., or dentist. (Males and females run together.)
- Media Mile.** Entrants must be affiliated with T.V., Radio, magazine, or newspaper organizations.
- Police, Firefighters Mile.** Entrants must be full-time police officer or firefighter. (Males and females run together.)
- The Mayor's Invitational Mile.** A prediction race for city dignitaries. Entrants will demonstrate their sense of timing and pace. There are not allowed to wear watches.

ENTRY INFORMATION

The entry fee is \$5.00. Entries should be mailed to the Atlanta Track Club, 3097 E. Shadowlawn, Atlanta, Georgia, 30305, and are to be postmarked no later than April 6, 1986.

LATE ENTRIES

For a \$7 fee, runners may register in person at the ATC clubhouse until 7 p.m. April 10. THERE WILL BE NO RACE DAY REGISTRATION.

COURSE

The start is at the intersection of Linden Avenue and Peachtree Street. The race heads south on Peachtree Street to the finish at the southwest end of Central City Park. The finish line is at the intersection of Edgewood Avenue and Peachtree Street.

PROCEEDS

All proceeds will go to the establishment of the Atlanta Track and Field Development Trust Fund. This fund will be administered by representatives of the City of Atlanta and The Atlanta Track Club. The fund will be dedicated to the support of track and field athletes and clubs who serve age groups 18 and under in non-scholastic competition.

TRANSPORTATION AND PARKING

In planning your trip to the starting line, remember that Peachtree Street along the course will be closed to all traffic. Also, there will be no parking on the streets around the starting line. The entire Civic Center parking lot has been reserved for Peachtree Miles. You can park free. This area will also be best for warming up. The race course has been selected especially for its convenience to MARTA train stations. North Avenue Station near the start and Five Points Station near the finish allow you to park and ride with maximum convenience. Please utilize public transportation and help us allow easy, fast access by foot, in and out of the highly congested start and finish areas.

ASSEMBLY INFO

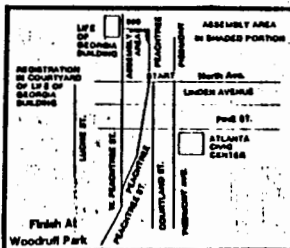
Look at the enclosed map and diagrams to see the location of the assembly area at the corner of North Avenue and Peachtree Street. Your age group will be assembled here 15 minutes prior to starting time for your race. (See race schedule.) *DO NOT ARRIVE at this area earlier than 15 minutes before your race. You will assemble according to your age and the color of your number. The number must be worn on the front of your shirt.

STARTING LINE PROCEDURES

Five minutes before your race, you will be escorted to the starting line area at Peachtree and North Avenue. A race official will line up the fastest runners first and work back at 30 second-per-mile race differences. Please cooperate by lining up by ability, so everyone can get off to a clean, fast start.

RACE NUMBER PICKUP

Race number pickup will begin in the assembly area at North and Peachtree at 7:30 a.m. on the morning of the race and will continue until 10 minutes before the last race.

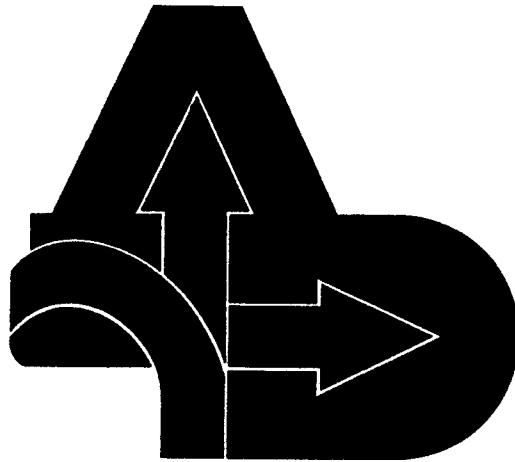

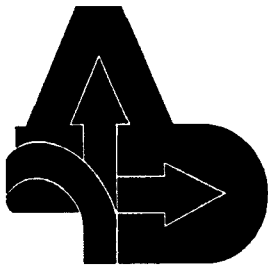

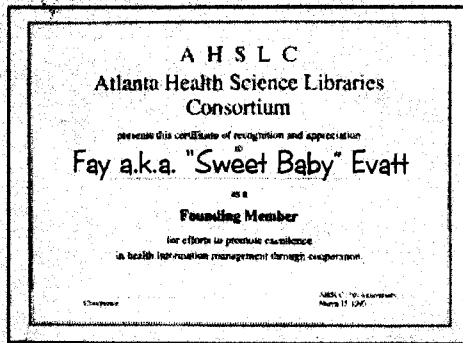

- Received Baptist's highest award – The Extra Service to Patients (ESP) award

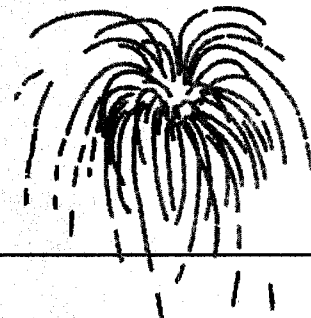

CONTINUING YOUR EDUCATION

In June the name of the Emory University Division of Librarianship was changed to the Emory Division of Library and Information Management, reflecting changes in the curriculum which were effected Summer Quarter of 1981. NAME CHANGE?

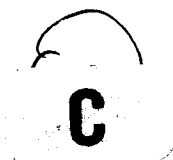

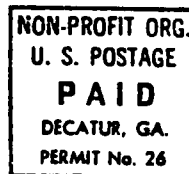

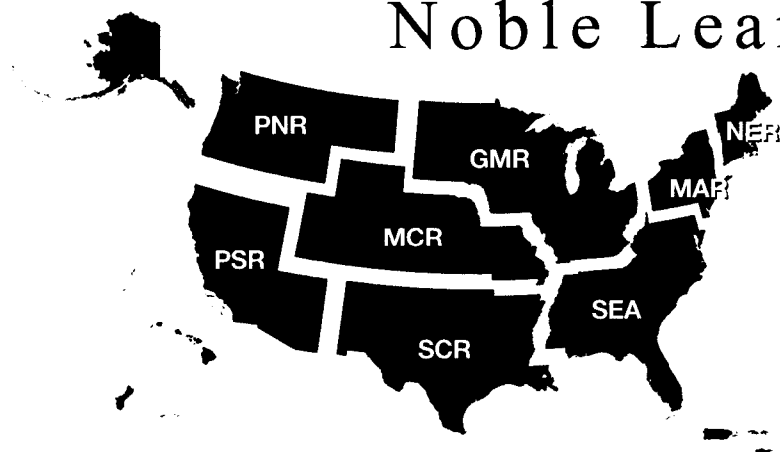
