Identifying and Addressing Publishing and Presenting Barriers: A Discussion Between New and Seasoned Librarians

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What do you think the biggest barrier is for librarians who want to present or publish?







What factors contribute to or inhibit publishing among medical librarians

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Objective

To discover what factors influence librarians to publish or present their work. The study aims to determine what type of publications and presentations are most prevalent, what external factors impact the decision to publish or present, what internal factors affect the decision, and why one chooses to do one rather than the other or both.

Methodology

Data were collected using an electronic questionnaire sent to various listservs. including the Medical Library Association, Special Libraries Association, Association of Academic Health Sciences Libraries, and regional MLA chapters. The questionnaire was developed by the researchers and it consisted of both quantitative and qualitative items.

Participants were 209 health sciences librarians from across the United States. However, three sets of questions regarding presentations of research caused confusion among many of the participants and the number of poster vs. paper presentations did not match their total number of presentations. Only the 102 participants whose responses were correctly matched were included in that part of the analysis.

Factors affecting publication of journal articles were analyzed using multiple regression. A combination of descriptive statistics and axial coding were used to determine factors influencing and inhibiting publication and presentation of research.

Results

- · Preferred publishing or presenting equally #1.50.8%
- · Preference for quantitative research over qualitative or mixed methodology · Equal mix of peer reviewed and non-peer
- reviewed publishing · Research presented at all conference levels
- local, regional, and national · Most of presentations were in poster format

Factors that influence librarians

The most common factors that contribute to publication or presentation of research are:

- · an interest in conducting research, · encouragement from a colleague or supervisor.
- · resume enhancement,
- · interest in learning new information.

The most common factors that inhibit publication or presentation of research are:

- not enough time. · not encouraged to do so by colleague or
- supervisor, · no mentor to assist with the process,
- · a lack of travel funds.

Who is most likely to publish?

A librarian in a tenury track position, having publications as a job requirement, and a greater, number of years in the profession.

Conclusion




